Offers will be made by **Friday 12th February 2027**, with the deadline to accept a Year 7 place on **Friday 5th March 2027**.

SIXTH FORM ENTRY

Entry into the Sixth Form is dependent upon GCSE performance and your current school's reference. The minimum requirement is five GCSEs at Grade 4, but most subjects require a minimum of a Grade 5 or 6 for entry onto the particular course.



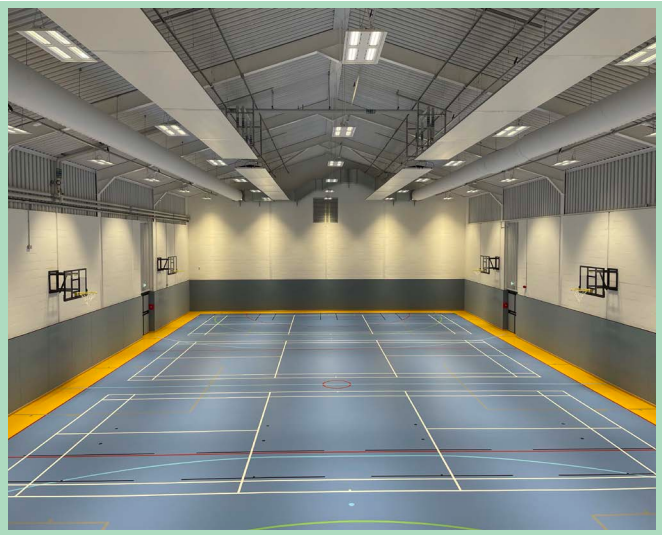
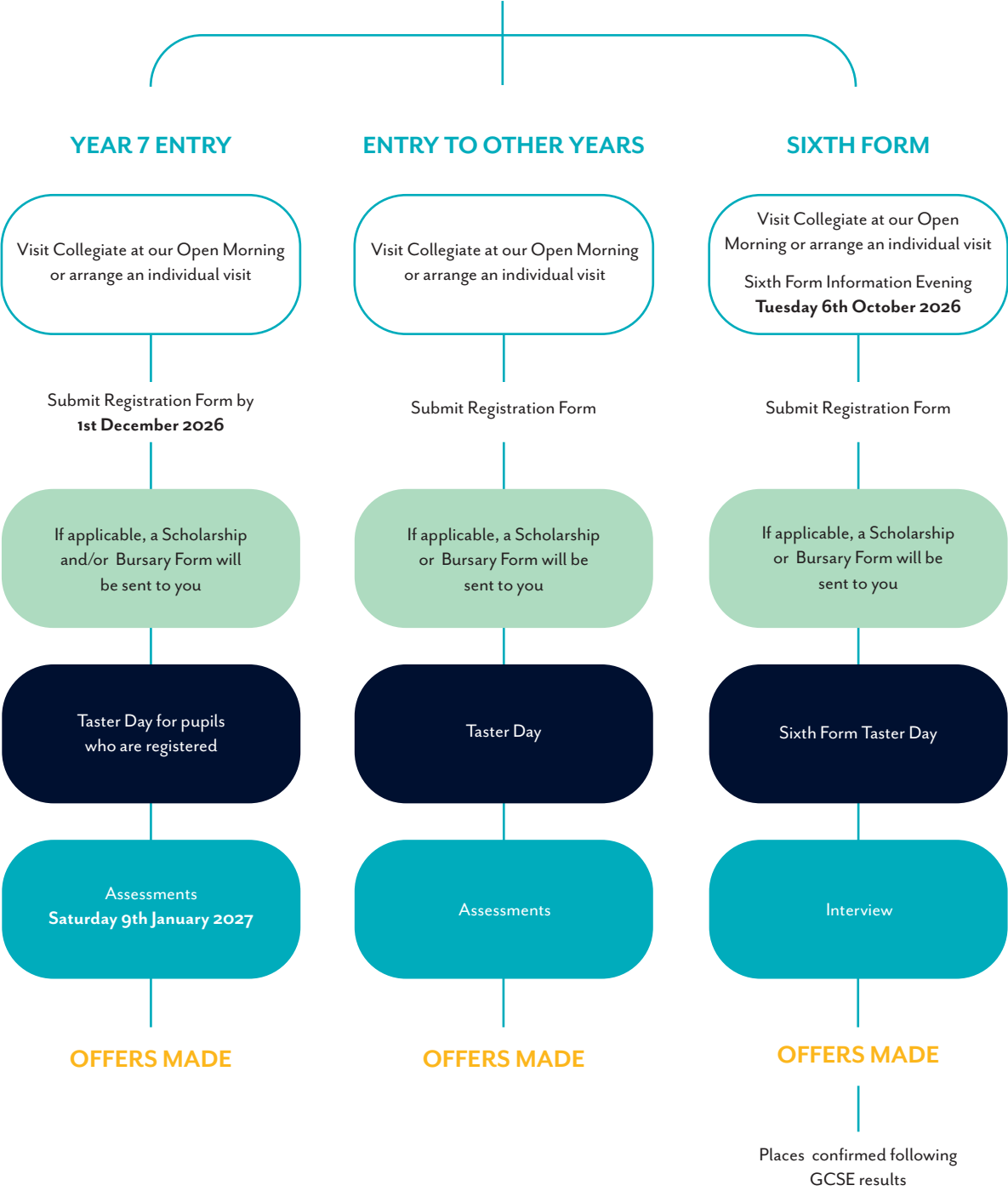

## SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES

### ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS ENTRY AT 11+

The Year 7 entrance assessments identify potential academic scholars. All prospective pupils are automatically considered and no separate application is required.

The Head will invite high performers to an interview. If successful, scholars receive their award for the duration of their education, provided they continue good academic performance, progress and conduct.

### ENTRY TO OTHER YEAR GROUPS

All applicants, regardless of entry point, are considered for an academic scholarship following their entrance assessment and interview with the Head. Those that perform to a very high standard may receive a scholarship for the duration of their education, subject to continued good academic performance, progress and conduct.

## NON-ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS AT 11+ AND 16+

### WHO SHOULD APPLY?

Scholarships are also available in sports, music, art and drama. These scholarships are for candidates who have achieved a high standard in these areas and who demonstrate potential to excel. ### WHAT IS THE PROCESS FOR SELECTION?

In addition to your completed registration form and fee, you will need to submit a scholarship application form. The admissions team will send you the relevant scholarship application form once your registration form and fee has been received.

For Year 7 entry, assessments for non-academic subject scholarships take place in January, usually on the same day as the entrance assessments. Assessments for other year groups will happen on an individual basis.

### AWARDS

Scholarship awards are typically between 5 and 15% of tuition fees. All award holders are expected to work hard and to be fully involved in the life of the school.

## FINANCE

### THE CURRENT SCHOOL FEES ARE:

Senior School..... £7,570 (incl of VAT) **per term**

Catering charge .....£375 **per term**

The catering charge covers lunch and team teas.

There are some other miscellaneous charges and these are detailed on the Fee Schedule.

### OTHER CHARGES MADE IN ARREARS

Learning support is available in the Senior School. Charges are made on an individual basis and parents will be advised separately.

All school fees and extras are reviewed and amended on an annual basis.

## BURSARIES

The Governors of Collegiate are committed to broadening access to the school. At the point of entry into the Senior School, parents may apply for means-tested financial support in the form of a bursary. The school is fortunate to receive support from the Hilborne Foundation, the Roger Newport Foundation and the OC Charitable Trust, among others, to facilitate this.

Prospective parents wishing to apply for a bursary must indicate this on their registration form and complete the bursary application form. All bursary applicants pay a £70 administration charge, in addition to the registration fee, and complete a statement of financial circumstances. The school uses an external bursary consultant to help facilitate the application process.
